

## Undergraduate Student Poster Presentation Guidelines

Annual Idaho INBRE Summer Research Conference - Moscow, ID Undergraduate Student  
Poster Presentations – Tuesday, July 27, 2021

**36" tall x 48" wide**

- Poster dimensions:**  
Wider or taller posters will not fit properly on the display boards.
- Scientific Poster 'Best Practices':**
  - **Word count:** The entire poster should use <750 words (including the Abstract!).
  - **Title:** The Title should state the conclusions.
  - **Authors and Institution(s)**
  - **Abstract:** 250 words
  - **Background information:** Very briefly, tell why the research is important.
  - **Hypothesis (if appropriate):** Make a succinct statement.
  - **Materials and methods:** Usually presented as a schematic
  - **Results:** Graphs and Tables in which the legend or title state the result, not the topic.
    - **NOT:** 'Gene expression in cancer cells'
    - **INSTEAD:** 'Myeloma cells have a five-fold increase in phospholipase D expression'
  - **Discussion:** Very briefly, what do your results mean?
  - **Conclusion:** Often a short bulleted list.
  - **Appropriate citations and logos (as described below)**
- Cite the relevant funding agencies, INBRE, COBRE, and/or whatever applies to you** as well as the logo of your host institution. The Idaho INBRE logo is available at [inbre.uidaho.edu/cite\\_inbre/](http://inbre.uidaho.edu/cite_inbre/). As of April 2013, NIH does NOT want its logos used to indicate NIH funding. **Instead of NIH logos, please use wording such as: Supported by an Institutional Development Award (IDeA) from the National Institute of General Medical Sciences of the National Institutes of Health under Grant #P20GM103408.**
