

Idaho INBRE Funding Opportunity Announcement (FOA): Seminar Series/Grant or Manuscript Writing Workshop

Funding opportunity description:

This funding opportunity is aimed at primarily undergraduate institutions (PUIs) and is designed to bring speakers of national/international prominence to campus or provide a writing workshop. Speakers should provide up-to-date biomedical research findings/practices and interact with faculty and students during their visit.

Applications: A two-page proposal is required with a seminar series outline that includes a timeframe, a list of potential speakers, their area of expertise, and how this seminar series integrates with either the campus research programs or curriculum. Seminars should include faculty and student attendance and being open to the general public is encouraged. Travel arrangements and other details will be made between the speaker and the applicant institution if awarded.

Eligible Organizations: Brigham Young University-Idaho, College of Idaho, Lewis-Clark State College, and Northwest Nazarene University.

Award budget: Applicants may request up to \$10,000 in direct costs (F&A not allowed). Funding can cover domestic travel and accommodations for speakers including fees. Be sure to follow your institutional policy regarding appropriate compensation for speakers. No food, beverages, or honoraria may be requested (these can be paid from INBRE returned overhead/discretionary funds or other non-INBRE sources).

Funding Criteria:

Budget requests are flexible and should reflect your specific need(s). The dates of the seminar series or workshop must occur prior to February 28, 2019. Funds must be spent by February 28, 2019.

Review and Selection Process:

We expect to fund up to three proposals depending on available funds. Selection will be based on scientific quality, the plan to accomplish the award goal, a reasonable target date, and budget request justification. All applications will be reviewed and selected externally.

Reporting:

If you accept this award, you will be required to cite the Idaho INBRE award in seminar advertisements and during seminar introductions. In addition, you will be obligated to report the outcome of this funding including the number of seminar attendees. Progress reports are due annually. The due date and specific requirements for your annual report will be based on NIH requirements.
